

Marking Code ~ Years 1-6

SP = spelling mistake (drawn above/next to the incorrect spelling) ~ corrected in the margin on the same line

CP = missing or incorrect use of capital letter ~ corrected in the margin or above/to the side

✓ = if correct and shows evidence of the lesson's learning objective(s) - except in extended writing pieces where it is used to show application of previously learned skills or genre-specific skills

VF = to show verbal feedback and a written indication of the verbal prompt given

✓✓ = to show where the verbal feedback has had a positive impact

X and he went **X** = a cross at either side of a word/phrase/sentence which is repeated/doesn't make sense

Whitch = children to use a ruler and a single line to cross out a mistake in their work (or rubber if publishing)

 = shows examples of the learning objectives being met in a child's extended piece of writing

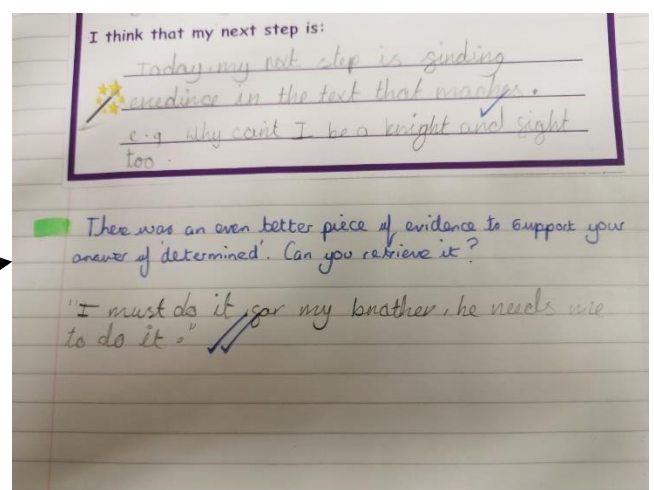
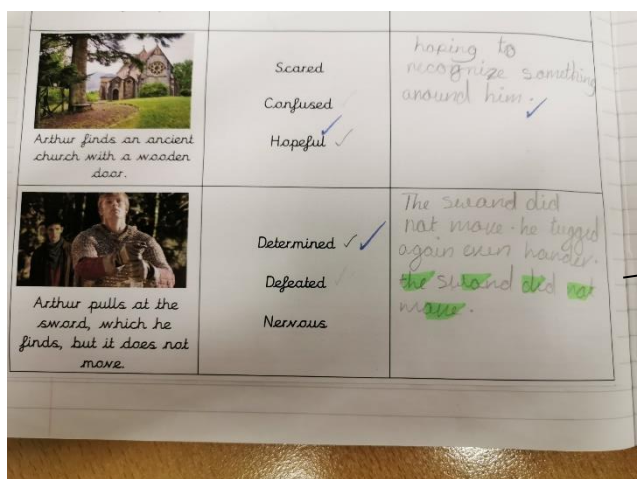
 = shows an example of work to be improved/corrected in a child's writing/reading/maths book

Sometimes, a green mark will also need to be supported with a comment which enables the child to understand how to correct the mistake and/or what the mistake is. ✓✓ to indicate the child has successfully corrected their mistake
